Co-option of Sarn Councillor. - Brian Pryce was co-opted in as your new Sarn Councillor.

KCC Planning Application Consultations

19/0097/FUL Focus School, Sarn, SY16 4EJ - Continued siting of a portacabin for 2 years, for use as a classroom. KCC Response. "After making a visit to the site and having viewed the portacabin in question KCC wishes to make you aware of the following points. The portacabin is not currently used as a classroom and has not been put to that purpose for some long period of time. This is the third extension to the temporary statuses of two years granted to the original application.

It appears to make a mockery of the system by the continued non-removal of the cabin as set out in the conditions and then making late application for an extension.

"Therefore, KCC object to this application and request the portacabin be removed."

Planning Service - Publishing 3rd Party Correspondence

Gayle Frewin Planning Technician & Monitoring Officer PCC. As a result of implemented and proposed reductions in staffing levels, the Planning Department no longer has the resources to continue to appropriately redact and publish third party correspondence on the Councils website (i.e. letters of objection and support). In light of recent data protection incidents, it is also considered that the risk of publishing third party correspondence is too great and not publishing third party correspondence will result in the risk being considerably reduced. Therefore, it has been regrettably agreed that only planning applications and associated supporting information and consultee responses will be published on the Councils website.

Please note that in line with other local planning authorities that have taken this stance, planning application files (redacted) will be made available at the Planning Offices where requested. Please note that we will monitor the implementation of this decision to ensure that any issues that arise are addressed promptly.

This issue is causing considerable concern to Councillors and residents alike; following in depth discussion the Clerk is requested to forward a letter requesting that PCC review their actions. Clerk also to approach OVW and MCG seeking their views and support.
