Special meeting
Nov 11.

A Special meeting of the Parish Council was held at the Rectory Room on Tuesday Nov 11th at 7 o'clock.

The minutes of the Quarterly meeting held Oct 28 were read & confirmed.

Correspondence received from W. John Agricultural Organisation was read & agreed to.

Resignation of Clerk.

A letter was received from W. J. Williams intimating that owing to ill-health, he felt compelled to resign his duties as Clerk to the Parish Council & Assistant Overseer.

Much regret was expressed by the members of the Council, but under the circumstances, it was felt there was no alternative but to accept the resignation.

The following resolution was therefore proposed by Councillor Mrs. Lewis seconded by Council D. Morgan that "The heavy Parish Council receive with much regret the resignation of W. Williams as Clerk to the Parish Council & Assistant Overseer, wish to express their high appreciation of his past services & courtesy during the 30 years he has held office, and at the same time to condole with him in his illness, trusting that his health would speedily improve."

The Chairman was requested to communicate the resolution to W. Williams.

The Chairman was also requested to send in to the Montgomeryshire Excess & County Taxes an advertisement for a Clerk to the Parish Council - Assistant Overseer at a Salary of £35 yearly. All applications to be sent to the Chairman by Saturday Nov. 22nd.

It was also decided to hold a Special meeting of the Council on Tuesday Nov 25th to receive any applications, & to make an appointment. If the applicants were not considered suitable, the Council to invite & appoint a non-applicant at the above mentioned Salary.

Letters from the Ministry of Health in reference to the proposed Burial Ground were read & approved. The Chairman intimated that when the new Clerk was appointed the Council should instruct him to write the Solicitors of Dolfforgan Estate a letter which would be handed to the Trustees of the Dyrlymorch Estate stating that the Parish Council in order to avoid an increase of legal costs, had instructed the trustees of the Dolfforgan Estate to purchase from the trustees of the Dyrlymorch Estate the fields called puddyeon. Afterwards the trustees of the Dolfforgan Estate would hand over to the Parish Council part of that field & part of Maesman in accordance with agreement between the two parties.
