4) APPROVAL OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING MINUTES from 9th July 2025

5) ELECTION OF OFFICERS – The Chair and Vice-Chair should be elected every year and may preside for a maximum of 2 but both Carmen and Phil have done 3 and wish to step down. None of the other members present were willing to put themselves forward for the role. There was a discussion about the roles. Although with only quarterly meetings and less statutory obligations than the Community Councils themselves, the jobs are not onerous but there is a need for the Chair and Vice-Chair to be a guiding spirit as well as the formal managers of meetings. It was decided that the matter would be postponed until the following meeting when effort will be made to ensure better attendance and a focus on a more ambitious vision for the group

6. FOOTPATH UPDATE

- i. Brett Kibble gave an update on the significant delays in getting the footpath volunteer networks up and running at County level since the policy was launched in October 2025. To date, only 2 groups in the whole of the County are known to exist including the VMRC. Sian Barnes is anxious to have systems in place for July this year.
- ii. More volunteers are expected to come on board from Churchstoke

9. REPORTS FROM EACH COUNCIL INCLDING REVIEW OF NATURE DAYS IN BOTH KERRY AND BERRIEW

Berriew

- i) Woodland walk has been completed
- ii) Interactive speed signs being installed in the village
- iii) Bus routes and times under review
- iv) Circular walk and heritage trail comprising stories of buildings and people with audio commentary accessible via QR code
- v) New headteacher at the school
- vi) Most community assets are devolved into independent committees which draw upon a very broad spectrum of volunteers and energy
- vii) The Nature Day was really successful with 25 stalls and at least 200 attendees. The initiative had built on last year's achievement and there is enthusiasm for repeating it next year. Lord Hague, Steve Witherden MP, Elwyn Vaughan MS and Adrian Jones (PCC) all attended. One of the favourite activities was the nature promise tree with paper butterflies to write on

Kerry

- i) Nature Day was also very successful. Carmen shared some of the remaining cloth bags designed by the school children which acted as quite a draw for those families. The art work and production was co-ordinated by Susan. There was a last minute decision to hold the majority of the event indoors due to unpredictable weather. Russell George opened the event with great aplomb and proceeded to attend all the stalls and engage enthusiastically with the activities and participants and took a little jar terrarium home at the end of it. All stall holders said they would be happy to repeat the experience next year. One really big problem was the parking especially as there had been a funeral in the morning. This issue is a major impediment to any scaling up of such an event again.
- ii) Clerk to share photos and report on VMRC web-site page
- iii) Carmen attended the Powys Teaching Health Board drop-in session in Newtown last week. There is also an intention to have online sessions for Community Councils to be appraised of developments. There was a possibility that the library might be demolished to make way for the hub and then be partially re-absorbed into the new facility. The members felt strongly that this would not be a workable plan and that parking in particular is going to be a massive problem however it is built.
- iv) The Council continue to work on the new Football Club lease renewal
- v) The river bank re-build is inching forward with sheet piles having been bought at a good price following attention to global steel markets
- vi) There are proposals for the shop to be re-located to a site near the Village Hall in a prefabricated modular bank unit. It is anticipated that the Post Office salary will aid financial sustainability

Abermule and Llandyssil

- i) A Deed of Dedication is being organised for the new play area. Equipment has been ordered and will be installed after the summer holidays
- ii) It has been noticed that very few planning applications are being submitted which may reflect problems with the local and national economy

- Llandyssil 'Old Road' U2657 2 stiles to change to gates.
- Kerry promoted walk to Penaran Cottage 3 stiles to convert to gates on 217/128/3&4
- Kerry promoted walk Nook Lane stiles to replace on 217/123/1
- Kerry near Moat footpath gate long outstanding on 217/124/2
- Churchstoke bridges to sort on 210/29/2 and 210/62/2 and 210/62/1
- Roundton stile near collapse at entry to MWT reserve on 210/96/1
- Berriew promoted walk awkward stile replace with gate on 203/6/1
- Berriew promoted walk above Pant-y-ffridd pedestrian gate at awkward fieldgate on 203/18/1
- Gates to be installed at Wernllwyd etc on 261/C18/5 and 261/C16/1
- Stile on Montgomery Kerry road to replace on 210/54/3
